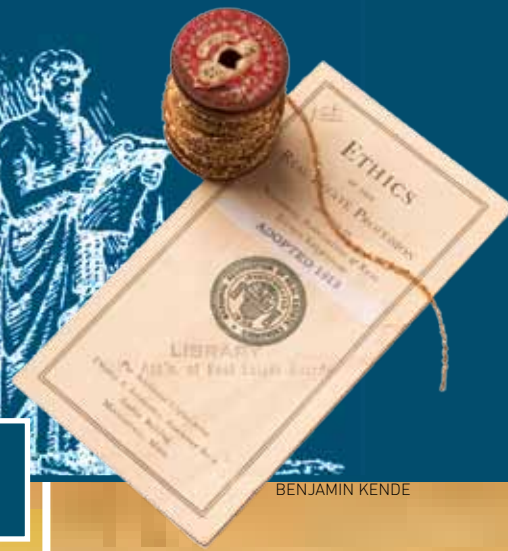


THE CODE HITS 100

The NAR Code of Ethics is known as the "golden thread" of the real estate profession.

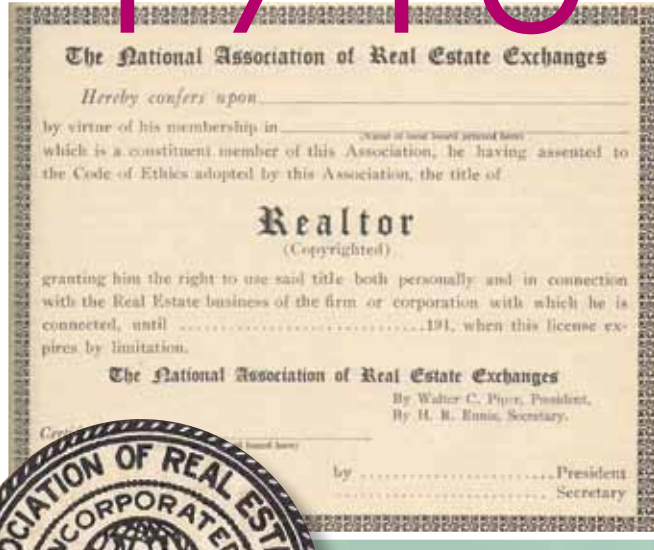

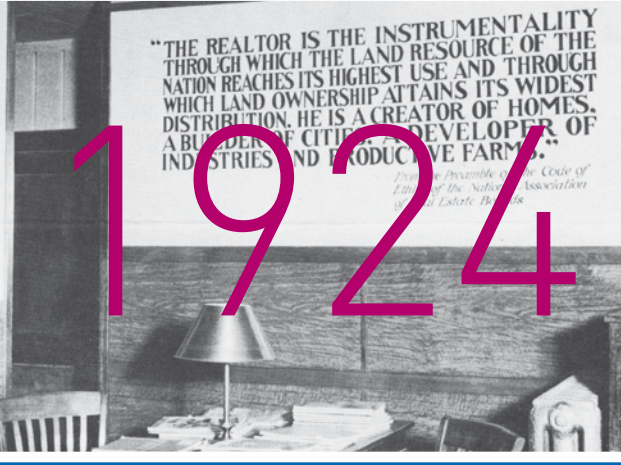
THE YEAR 2013 MARKS THE CENTENNIAL OF THE CODE OF ETHICS.

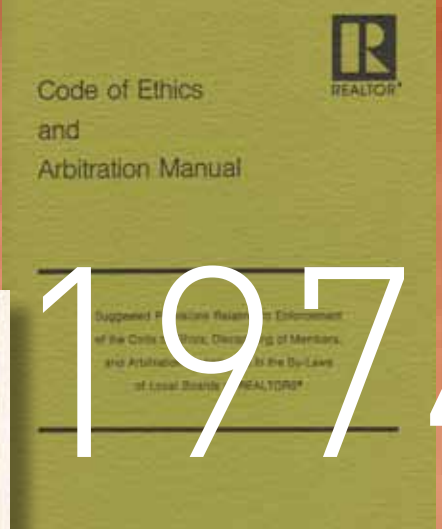

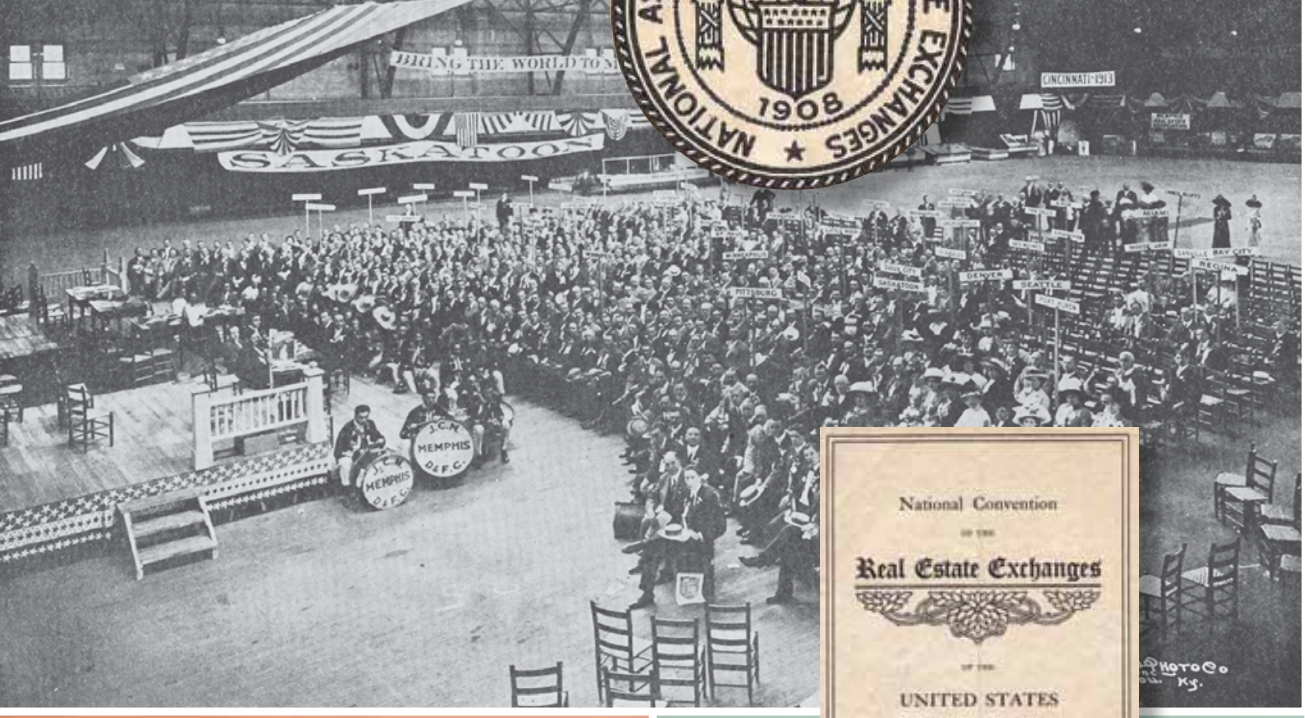

Article 10 was adopted to provide equal professional services to all persons.

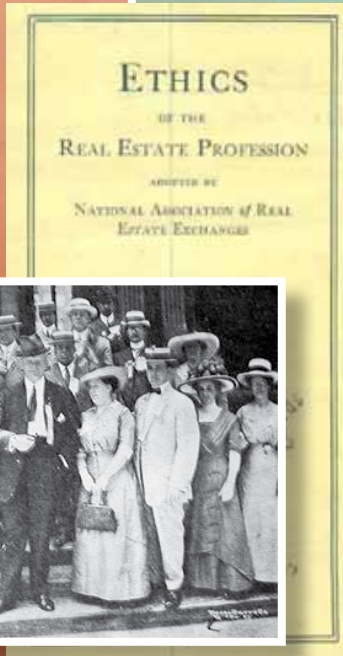

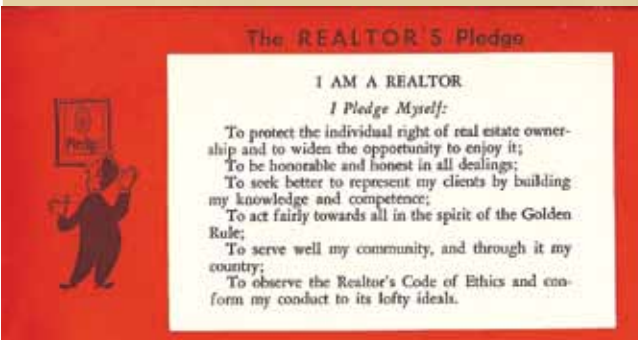


The classical-style drawing first appeared in 1926 as part of a Code of Ethics "window display."



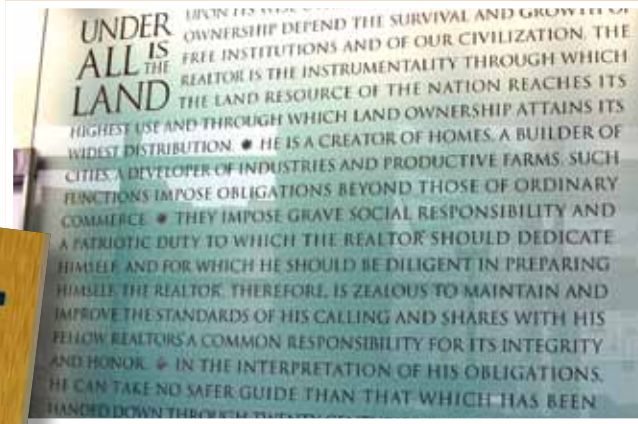

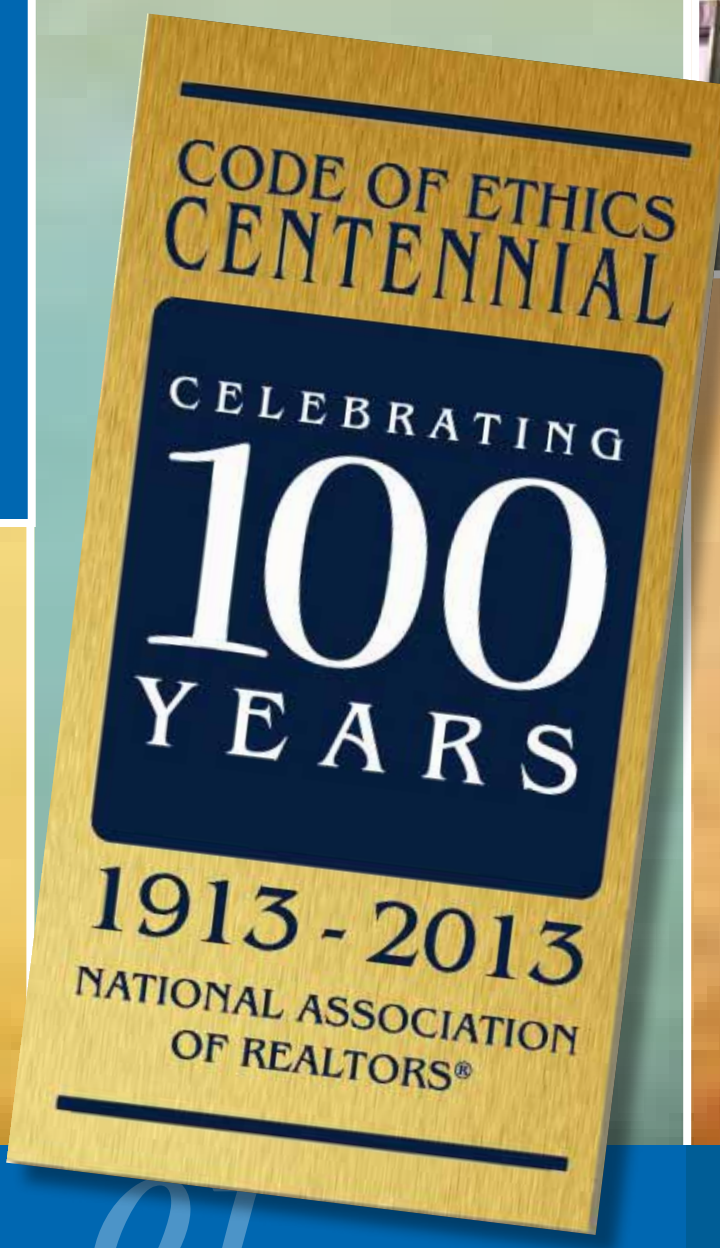
Article 10 provides for equal services regardless of race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status, national origin, or sexual orientation.
